2016-2017 Eco-Schools \$500 Sustainability Mini-Grant Application

Walking Mountains Science Center is providing \$500 mini-grants for Eagle Valley schools that commit to earning a Bronze, Silver, or Green Flag award for any of the Eco-Schools ten sustainability pathways. This money can be used to support the Eco-Schools program at the recipient's K-12 school. For example, funds can be used to purchase tools or resources, to help implement a specific action, or to provide funds for a field trip. All or a portion of the money may be used to compensate staff for planning and instructional time for the Eco-Schools program.

Eco-Schools Bronze Award Criteria

To receive a Bronze Award, you need to earn 100 points. The actions noted below must be taken for each of the Seven Steps as follows:

Eco-Action Team (15 points total)

- Identify an Eco-Action Team composed of a diverse group of teachers and students. (5 pts.)
- Team meets at least 4 times a year and keeps minutes at each meeting. (5 points)
- The group informs the whole school of committee discussions and actions. (5 points)

Environmental Audit (20 points total)

- Conduct an energy audit of the school. Schools may develop their own criteria or use the Eco-Schools USA template. (5 points)
- Students are involved in conducting the audit. (5 points)
- Audit results are shared with the whole school. (5 points)
- We recommend that you conduct an audit annually to measure your progress. However, for this award level, you need only complete it once. (5 points)

Eco-Action Plan (15 points total)

- Results from the Energy Audit are used to create a basic action plan. (5 points)
- The Eco-Action Plan is shared with the whole school community. (5 points)
- The Eco-Action Plan is used to take some level of action at the school to reduce energy use. (5 points)

Monitoring and Evaluation (20 points total)

- Eco-Action Team identifies and monitors progress towards achieving the actions stated in the Eco-Action Plan. (5 points)
- Successes and challenges are noted in meeting minutes. (5 points)
- Energy data is entered on the award application. (10 points)

Linking to the Curriculum (10 points total)

 Students have an opportunity at most grade levels and across disciplines to integrate environmental issues into the classroom, on the school site or in the local community. (10 points)

Informing the Community (10 points total)

 The school has a prominent, designated way to communicate with the whole school and greater community such as a bulletin board, website or newsletter which details Eco-Schools USA activities. (10 points)

Eco-Code (10 points total)

• The school develops an Eco-Code with input from the whole school. The code is agreed upon and adopted by the school. (10 points)
